

The government has tightened fire safety regulations for residential complexes. These rules are essential for your safety and that of your neighbors. In case of a fire or other emergency, emergency services must have easy access to the building and your home. You also need to be able to evacuate safely without tripping over objects that block escapes or walking routes. Find out what has changed, and what you need to do below.



What is no longer allowed?


No items may be placed in hallways, stairwells, entrances or exits. Escape routes must always remain clear. This means you cannot leave bicycles, strollers, mobility scooters, plants, furniture, garbage bags or any other belongings in these areas.





What is still allowed?

You may hang one small frame next to your front door, with a maximum size of 0.5 m². A doormat is also allowed, with a maximum size of 0.5 m². A standard doormat of 60 cm by 40 cm fits within this limit.
